

Dear Prospective Student:

Thank you for your interest in Indiana University South Bend. We're happy for this opportunity to introduce you to the Clinical Laboratory Science Program-Degree Completion pathway.

The Clinical Laboratory Science curriculum, which has been approved by the Indiana Commission of Higher Education (ICHE), leads to the

Bachelor of Science in Clinical Laboratory Science (BS-CLS)

The I.U. South Bend campus currently offers one baccalaureate degree. The **BS-CLS** is designed for those preparing to enter the profession with a four-year degree. Students who finish this degree will be prepared to sit for the American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) certification exam, to become a nationally certified Medical Laboratory Scientist (MLS).

There are two pathways to admission within the BS-CLS program. Traditional, returning, and second degree seeking students are encouraged to enter the program under the pre-CLS degree heading and apply for program acceptance within their second (sophomore) or third academic year (junior year) using the *Traditional Pathway*, which acts in a cohort model and enrolls once per year. New students with a pre-existing MLT or equivalent degree are able to enroll in the program through the *Degree Completion Pathway*, which allows students to work at an indenpendent pace and has rolling enrollment. However, all students regardless of major or degree status are eligible to apply based on meeting the below eligibility requirements.

CLINICAL LABORATORY SCIENCE ADMISSION PROCESS:

The Vera Z. Dwyer College of Health Sciences Division of Clinical Laboratory Science conducts a comprehensive review of each eligible application. We believe that prior work experience and associates degree completion in Medical Laboratory Science or related field are strong indicators of students success.

Several policies can directly affect you during the admission process or in the years ahead. Please read the policies listed below so that you have clear understanding of the admission requirements and the expectations of you as a clinical laboratory science student. This booklet is NOT a substitute for the IUSB Bulletin and IUSB College of Health Sciences Handbook.

If you have any questions concerning these policies, please contact a health sciences advisor before submitting your application.

Admission Requirements (Degree Completion Pathway)

For your application to be considered for BS-CLS admission, you must be able to meet the requirements listed below within the spring term prior to which you intend to begin your CLS coursework. Full Acceptance will be awarded to those who have all requirements completed at the time of the faculty review.

- Successfully complete an associate's degree, of at least 60 credits, within a NAACLS accredited
 MLT or equivalent program. (See Addendum 1 for an example of lvy Tech transfer credits)
- Be admitted to Indiana University as a degree-seeking student prior to admission to the CLS program. Transfer students must submit official transcripts for all courses taken outside the IU system to the Office of Admissions. The Office of Admissions will evaluate the course work for possible transfer credit and will issue a Credit Transfer Report.
- 3. Successfully complete all developmental courses as determined by the IUSB placement exams. Developmental courses include: ENG- W 130, MATH-A 100, MATH-M 107, or EDUC-U 100.*
- 4. Students are required to achieve a minimum cumulative grade-point-average (cgpa) of 2.5 in all transferred courses.
- 5. Repeat fewer than 3 courses with a grade lower than C-, only 2 of which are science courses, as outlined in the college repeat policy.
- 6. Applicants must register for and submit to a criminal background history check (see advising for details) at their own expense upon application to CLS programs. This complies with state and federal regulations for individuals in clinical settings and working with patients and individuals who are vulnerable or minors. Applicant should also read the Criminal Information Sheet and submit a signed Criminal History Disclosure Form with this application for admission.

 Additional information regarding this process was given to you at the time you picked up this application.
- 7. Submit an application to the CLS program by the established deadlines.
- 8. Provide evidence of ASCP MLT certification or equivalent.

9. ESSAY REQUIREMENT

- a. In 250-300-words please describe how you have come to select clinical laboratory science as your chosen profession. When writing this essay, keep in mind the admissions (APG) Board expects to see evidence of your motivation for a CLS education, your understanding of the expectations of the CLS profession and demonstrated college-level writing. (This essay should be typed, 11 or 12 pt. font, 1 inch margins, double-spaced.)
- 10. Once acceptance decision is made (by August 1, 2017), sign and return an Acceptance of Offer of Admission by deadline stated in Acceptance letter.

ADMISSION SCORING

CLS admission decisions will be made based upon the following five (5) categories of scoring. They are:

Associates degree GPA	35%
Campus Enrollment Status	25%
Pre-existing MLT/laboratory certification	15%
Repeat factor	10%
Essay	10%

All of the above scoring categories are based upon a 4.0 scale.

ASSOCIATES DEGREE GPA - is the average of the sum of the course GPA listed on your associate's degree.

CAMPUS ENROLLMENT STATUS

PRE-EXISTING MLT/LABORATORY CERTIFICATION

Prior completion of an associate's level MLT program or completion of other acceptable laboratory certification (from ASCP or related national organizations) will provide a significant weight to entry into the program.

ESSAY

Essay scores will be calculated into the overall score and then ranked for admission. Members of the Division of Clinical Laboratory Science Admissions Board score essays as follows:

DEADLINES

Preferred application deadline is 5:00 p.m., May 1st, of the year of enrollment, however the Degree completion program application is accepted on a rolling basis. Either you may mail or hand-deliver the completed application. Do not ask someone else to deliver it for you. Applications received after this date will be so noted. Return this application to Shar Markham, Northside Hall - Secretary Station or Ian Clift, Northside 411.

It is required that you submit the application and any supporting documentation (transcripts, etc.) at the same time prior to the Application Deadline. Only completed Applications will be accepted, incomplete applications will be rejected (at the discretion of the Program Director).

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION STATUS

It is recommended that you obtain a copy of your Indiana University transcript and your current registration via your One.IU account when you complete this form. If you have difficulty completing the campus form, please meet with a DCHS Academic Advisor for assistance.

Applicants will be notified of their admission status by mail. An Acceptance of Admission (or Acceptance of Provisional Admission) form will accompany the acceptance letter, which is to be returned by the specified deadline. Notification of acceptance will be made no later than July 1, *year of enrollment*. All 3rd year fall courses will be verified for registration and checked for grades upon completion. These grades are not calculated into the application-grade-point-average. Those applicants accepted into the BS-CLS program will be expected to attend a mandatory orientation within the fall term. The date/times/location will be confirmed in your acceptance letter.

PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

Any offer of Provisional Admission is based upon the applicant's current cumulative grade point average, admission grade point average, incomplete or delayed application materials and courses completed. Failure to continue to meet all admission and application criteria and stated deadlines will result in revocation of the offer of Provisional Admission. Applicants who have received Provisional Admission and who continue to meet all admission and application criteria and stated deadlines will not receive additional confirmation of admission.
