

## **CPR Certification Requirements**

Students enrolled in Service Learning in Health Sciences are required to have *current* CPR certification. *The certification must be current through the end of the semester that you will be enrolled.* 

CPR certification ensures that you know what to do in the event of a medical emergency. This is a very valuable aspect of health care and many would argue that all people should receive knowledge in this area as you never know when a medical emergency will happen.

You are welcome to complete the certification at other locations. Many local hospitals, fire stations, or other healthcare facilities offer CPR training. Please ensure that the course involves the requirements of the American Heart Association and involves hands-on skills testing.

## Types of CPR Certification

To successfully complete the requirements of the <u>Vera Z. Dwyer College of Health</u> <u>Sciences (Links to an external site.)</u>, students are to have a certification from a BLS Provider with AED, like from the American Heart Association. Students with a current certification from the American Red Cross should connect with the instructor prior to submitting the assignment.

Medical facilities often have their own requirements for CPR Certification. Students should connect with their Community Site Supervisor to ensure their certification meets the needs of the site.
