IU SOUTH BEND ADVANTAGES

Flexibility - IU South Bend offers two different options for the RN to BSN program that can fit easily into your unique work and family schedule- *on campus* or *online*. The *on campus* option is primarily a part time program. RN's complete prerequisites then take two courses per semester with completion in five semesters. In the *on campus* option, the courses are taken sequentially, each over eight weeks so you only have to focus on one course at a time. In the *online option*, after general education requirements are met, nursing courses are provided in a web-based format. In the *online option* the student that takes a full time load (12 credits hours/semester) can complete the program within one year.

Reputation - Your degree comes from Indiana University School of Nursing, one of the top 20 nursing programs in the country. Your degree will be widely recognized and respected, no matter where you work or apply for further studies. The IU South Bend School of Nursing is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

Affordability – IU South Bend offers the only public college or university baccalaureate nursing program in the Northern Indiana/Southern Michigan area, which means reasonable tuition rates and access to financial aid.

Your Career - In today's job market, a bachelor's degree in nursing will increase your mobility and earning power. The BSN prepares you for career enhancement and transitions in the changing health care system. Graduates from the IU South Bend BSN program are able to evaluate current nursing practices, apply research findings, and develop new

approaches to leadership on the health care team. The BSN at IU South Bend prepares a generalist in professional nursing and provides an excellent foundation for graduate studies.

ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

BOTH PROGRAMS:

- Full admission to IU South Bend (\$35 application fee)
- Official College Transcripts from all colleges attended
- Verification of active, unencumbered RN License
- Completed and passed current criminal background check

On-Campus program track requires:

- Verification of graduation from an accredited program (NLNAC/ACEN or a program with an articulation agreement for the RN to BSN)
- Grade Point Average of 2.7 (or Equivalent) on 4.0 scale

On-line Program Track requires:

- Verification of graduation from a NLNAC/ACEN Accredited nursing program
- Grade Point Average of 2.5 (or Equivalent) on 4.0 scale

COURSES AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

A total of 52 general education credit hours are required—19 in critical analytical cluster (Science) and 30 in the combined humanities/culture/ communications cluster. Three credit hours are open for electives. Certain nursing course credit hours, depending on your experience, may be completed by submitting a professional portfolio. (The portfolio credits cannot be included in the minimum of 30 credit hours that must be taken at IU South Bend in order to receive a degree from IU)
