Guidelines:

- 1. In no more than 250 words (place the word count at the top of the essay under your name), respond to the following: Discuss your professional career goals and how you believe obtaining your MSN as a Family Nurse Practitioner will assist you in meeting those goals. Be as specific as possible.
- 2. Presentation is an important component of this essay. The Graduate Faculty Council considers the ability to use correct grammar and spelling, word choice, and adherence to directions as indicators of your ability to effectively and professionally communicate.
- 3. Review the rubric utilized by the Graduate Faculty Council to evaluate all admission essays.
